McHaney

1777; resigned 31st October, 1777; Ensign 3d Virginia, —, 1779; Lieutenant, —, 1780; wounded at Eutaw Springs 8th September, 1781.

McHaney, James (Va). 1st Lieutenant 5th Virginia, 25th March, 1776, to —.

Machenheimer, John (Md). Sergeant German Regiment, 29th July, 1776; Ensign, 17th August, 1777; resigned 31st May, 1778.

McHenry, Charles (Pa). 2d Lieutenant 4th Pennsylvania Battalion, 8th January, 1776; 1st Lieutenant 5th Pennsylvania, 1st January, 1777; Captain, 23d January, 1778; retired 1st July, 1778.

McHenry, James (Pa). Surgeon 5th Pennsylvania Battalion, 10th August, 1776; taken prisoner at Fort Washington 16th November, 1776; prisoner of war on parole until exchanged 5th March, 1778; Assistant Secretary to General Washington, 15th May, 1778; Major Continental Army, 25th May, 1781, to rank from 30th October, 1780; Major Aide-de-Camp to General Lafayette, 30th October, 1780, to 22d December, 1781; Secretary of War, 29th January, 1796, to 13th May, 1800. (Died 8th May, 1816.)

McDhaney, James (Va). 1st Lieutenant 10th Virginia, 25th March, 1776; Captain, 5th November, 1777; resigned 18th June, 1778.

McElhaney, John (Va). See **McElheney**.

McIlwaine, Stringer (N. C.). Lieutenant 2d North Carolina in 1777.

Machin, Thomas (Mass). Lieutenant in Gridley's Regiment Massachusetts Artillery, June to December, 1775; wounded at Bunker Hill, 17th June, 1775; 2d Lieutenant of Knox's Regiment Continental Artillery, 10th December, 1775; 1st Lieutenant, November, 1776; Captain-Lieutenant 2d Continental Artillery, 1st January, 1777; wounded at Fort Montgomery, 6th October, 1777; Captain, 21st August, 1780, and served to June, 1783; Captain 29th United States Infantry, 30th April, 1813; resigned 20th December, 1813. (Died 3d April, 1816.)

McIntire, Thomas (Pa). Ensign 3d Pennsylvania Battalion, 8th January, 1776; 2d Lieutenant, 8th March, 1776; wounded and taken prisoner at Fort Washington 16th November, 1776; exchanged 7th August, 1777; Lieutenant

of an Independent Company in Western Pennsylvania, 30th December, 1777; Captain, 8th March, 1779, and served to May, 1782.

McIntosh, Alexander (S. C.). Major 2d South Carolina, 17th June, 1775; Lieutenant-Colonel 3d South Carolina, — July, 1775, to —. (Died —, 1780.)

McIntosh, John (Ga). "Come and take it" Captain 1st Georgia, 7th January, 1776; Major, 14th September, 1776; Lieutenant-Colonel Commandant 3d Georgia, 1st April, 1778; wounded and taken prisoner at Briar Creek, 3d March, 1779; served to close of war. (Died 12th November, 1825.)

McIntosh, Lachlan (Ga). Colonel 1st Georgia, 7th January, 1776; Brigadier-General Continental Army, 16th September, 1776; wounded in a duel with Governor Gwinnett of Georgia, 16th May, 1777; taken prisoner at Charleston, 12th May, 1780; exchanged December, 1780, and served to close of war; Brevet Major General, 30th September, 1783. (Died 20th February, 1806.)

McIntosh, Lachlan Jr. (Ga). 1st Lieutenant 1st Georgia, 7th January, 1776; Brigade-Inspector, October, 1776, and served to —.

McIntosh, William (Ga). Ensign 1st Georgia, 7th January, 1776; 2d Lieutenant, March, 1776; 1st Lieutenant, December, 1776; Captain, 17th September, 1777, and served to close of war; Brevet Major, 30th September, 1783.

McIntosh, Wm. (Mass). Colonel Massachusetts Militia, 1776-1782. (Died 1813.)

McJunkins, Joseph (S. C.). Captain South Carolina Militia in 1777.

Mack, Orlando (Conn). 2d Lieutenant 8th Connecticut, 1st January, 1777; 1st Lieutenant, 16th February, 1777; retired 15th November, 1778.

Mackay, Eneas (Pa). Colonel 8th Pennsylvania, 20th July, 1776; died 14th February, 1777.

McKay, Fitzhugh (Va). Chaplain 15th Virginia, 25th April, 1777; regiment designated 11th Virginia, 14th September, 1778; resigned 1st October, 1778.

McKean, Robert (N. Y.). Captain of Wynkoop's Regiment New York Militia, 1st March to November, 1776; Captain 1st New York, 21st November, 1776, to rank from 1st March, 1776;
